

MONORAIL MAP



With rapid development of the city, traffic on the strip has become hugely congested at certain times of the day. This is exasperated by very long traffic lights at all major intersections. It can take as long as 50 minutes to go from one end of the strip to the other during peak times.

Shuttle Bus

Conexpo has organised free shuttle bus services between the convention centre and most major hotels during the show.

Taxi cab

Taxi cabs are generally only available from the front of hotels. You can hail one in the street, but succeeding at this during a busy show week is about as likely as seeing a flying pig. Taxis tend to avoid the strip due to the traffic and take alternative roads, this can make the trip seem very circuitous, it does not necessarily mean your driver is scalping you, it is almost always faster. All cabs have meters and charge a fixed fee of \$3.50 plus \$2.76 a mile or 54 cents a minute when stationary. There is a \$2.00 addition for airport pick-ups. Las Vegas drivers expect a decent tip and can get very unpleasant if you only give them a few cents. A couple of dollars on a \$10 to \$15 charge usually avoids the trail of insults. When everyone is heading out for the evening you can be subjected to a long wait in line, here are some alternatives:

Take the bus

The Deuce is a double deck bus that runs up and down the strip all day, the cost is \$6 for a two hour or \$8



for a 24 hour pass. You must either download the RTC app or have the exact change, you will not get on the bus unless you do. The service is hugely popular and even though there are buses every few minutes, they are invariably packed at peak times perhaps not during Conexpo when fewer bus type people are in town? It is also subject to vagaries of Strip traffic so can be slower than walking.

Go with the Monorail

This is fast and predictable taking 15 minutes in total to run from one end of the strip to the other. However it only runs on one side of the strip, behind the big hotels like Ballys

and MGM, so getting to a station from hotels on the opposite side can be a long walk. If you are going to or from the show a general rule of thumb is that the further you are away from the convention centre the more attractive a proposition it is. The Monorail operates from 7am to 2am (3am on weekends) A free shuttle bus runs to Sams Town and Rio hotels to the Monorail station. A three day ticket is included in the Conexpo entrance ticket, otherwise a one ride ticket is \$5.00, 24 hours is \$13 and a three day pass is \$29.00. In addition to traditional paper tickets, the Vegas Monorail also offers mobile tickets which can be scanned directly at the fare gates.



Con un desarrollo rápido de la ciudad, los atascos en la calle principal son un engorro a ciertas horas del día. Es consecuencia de la cantidad de semáforos que hay en cada esquina. Puede llevarle hasta 50 minutos cruzar de una punta a la otra del strip (calle principal).

Transporte en autobus

Conexpo ha organizado un servicio gratuito de autobuses entre la feria y la mayoría de los principales hoteles.

Taxis

Los taxis están generalmente solo disponibles en los hoteles principales, puede intentar parar alguno desde la calle, pero sera casi tan imposible como ver un cerdo volando. Los taxis tienden a evitar la calle principal y tomar calles alternativas, no crea que le están engañando, sino que esto es muchas veces la alternativa más rápida. Todos los taxis cuentan con taxímetro y cobran fijo \$3.50 más \$2.75 por milla o 54 centavos el minuto si está parado. Los taxistas

de Las Vegas normalmente esperan buenas propinas y no se lo toman muy bien si solo se les da unos centavos. Evitará malas caras si en una carrera de \$10 a \$15 les da dos dólares. Cuando cae la tarde y todo el mundo tiene prisa por llegar a sus citas, algunas alternativas son estas:

Coger el autobús

El Deuce es un autobús de dos plantas que funciona por toda la calle principal durante todo el día, el coste son \$6 un billete o \$8 un billete para todo el día. Debes descargar la aplicación RTC o llevar cambio exacto, si no, no le darán cambio. Hay mucho flujo de autobuses, aunque en horas puntas van bastante llenos. ¿Aunque a lo mejor la gente de Conexpo no se mueve en este tipo de transporte? Teniendo en cuenta el tráfico, habrá veces que llegue antes andando que en autobús.

Ir en Monorail

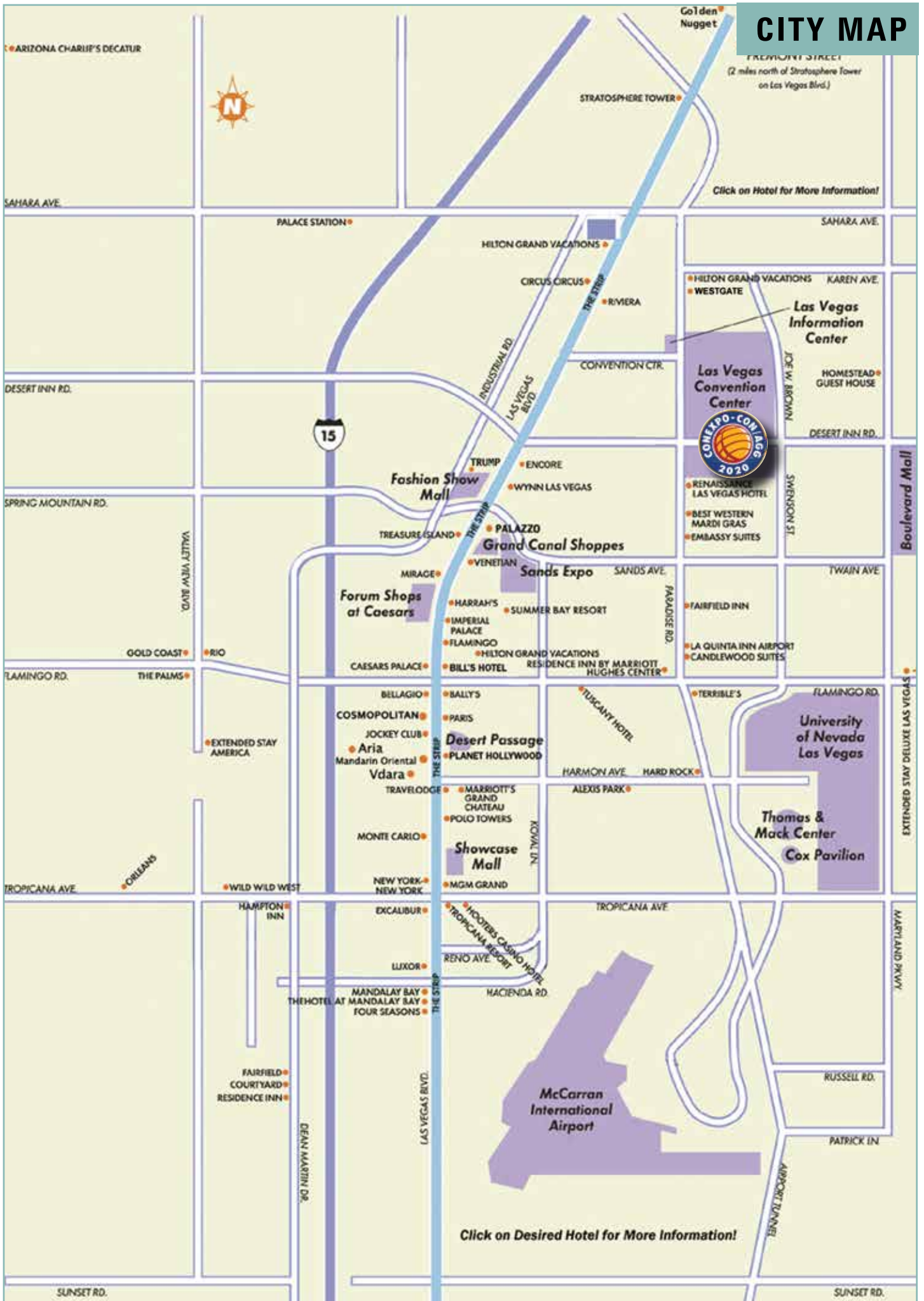
Una forma rápida de llegar de una punta a otra de la calle principal, en solo 15 minutos. Pero solo va por un lado de los hoteles, por

detrás de hoteles como el Ballys y MGM, por lo que llegar a una de las estaciones desde un hotel puede resultar una larga caminata. El Monorail opera desde las 7.00 am hasta las 2 am (3 am en fines de semana).

Un billete de ida son \$6. Hay un billete de 24 horas que cuesta \$10.80. Un billete para tres días son \$24. Hay disponibles otras ofertas. Se incluye un pase de tres días con el ticket de entrada de Conexpo; de lo contrario, un ticket de un viaje cuesta \$ 5.00, un ticket para 24 horas son \$13 y un pase de tres días cuesta \$29.00. Además de los ticket de papel tradicionales, el monorraíl de Vegas también ofrece tickets móviles que se pueden escanear directamente en las puertas.

Sights not to miss!

There are a great deal of things to see in Las Vegas and many of them are free, we like that! Here are just a few of them.



The fountains at Bellagio. More than a 1,000 fountains soar up to 240ft/73m as they perform a ballet to classic songs and music, every half hour in the afternoons and then every 15 minutes from 8pm till midnight. Inspiring!

The pirates and sirens battle at Treasure Island occurs every 90 minutes at 19:00, 20:30, 22:00 & 23:30 with a band of pirates battling it out with a bevy of buxom sirens, great pyrotechnics this one is a traffic stopper.



The Shark Reef at Mandalay Bay, a visit is not cheap but well worth seeing this 1.3 million gallon/6 million litre tank with walkways through it.

The Fremont street experience A few years ago the downtown street outside the **Golden Nugget** was roofed in with millions of light bulbs fitted to the inside to produce an amazing light show with 540,000 watts of music that is jaw droppingly incredible - every hour on the hour after dark.



The Mirage Volcano and waterfall, the volcano goes off at 7:00 and



8:00 PM each day plus 9:00 PM on weekends, spewing fire over 100ft/30m into the air as massive volumes of water rush over the edge.

The original Las Vegas glitz **Glitter Gulch** is the short narrow street incandescent with light bulbs and original neon!

The show at Circus Circus has often included famous acts and changes every half hour till midnight.

M&M World, yes really, is an attraction that includes a 3-D movie at the MGM and it's free.

The view from the top of the **Stratosphere tower** is amazing and if you are a little unbalanced there are also some crazy amusement rides.

The Forum shops at **Cesars Palace,** with its sky ceiling and

animated statues, a show is held every hour.



The Gondolas and minstrels at the Venetian not to mention the St Marks square where you seem to be outside.

The art collection at the Bellagio, some of the worlds finest and most expensive pieces. A Monet exhibition is on this week, entrance fee is \$15.

The Musical artefact displays at the **Hard Rock hotel and casino.**

The world's largest gold nugget at where else - **the Golden Nugget.**

The Strip at night try the view from the bar at the top of the Rio.

Paris, the Eifel tower might only be half size but the lights replicate those fitted for the 100th anniversary on the original tower and it was built to Gustave Eifels original drawings.

The High Roller is the world's largest observation wheel with 28 transparent pods holding 40 passengers each up to 550ft/170 metres thigh .

La Calle Fremont Hace años el downtown de la ciudad fuera del **Golden Nugget** estaba techado con millones de bombillas que te dejaban la boca abierta con 540,000 watos

de música - cada hora a partir de que se vaya el sol. La ostentación de **Las Vegas Glitter Gulch** es la calle estrecha incandescente con bombillas y neón!



El Volcán del Mirage y la cascada, el volcán se apaga a las 7:00 y las 8:00 PM cada día, y a las 9:00 PM los fines de semana, arrojando fuego sobre 100 pies / 30 metros en el aire con ingentes cantidades de agua sobre el borde.

El Arrecife de tiburones (Shark Reef) en **Mandalay Bay,** una visita nada barata pero que merece la pena con su pecera de 1.3 millones de galones /6 millones de litros con pasillos para pasar por debajo.

El espectáculo en el **Circus Circus** normalmente ha incluido números famosos y cambios cada media hora hasta media noche.

M&M World, si de verdad, es una

atracción que incluye una película en 3D en el MGM y es gratis.

La vista desde **la torre Stratosphere** es espectacular y si no le da miedo hay algunas atracciones encima de la torre.

Las Tiendas del Forum en el **Cesars Palace,** con su cielo y estatuas animadas, con un espectáculo cada hora.

Las Gondolas y Trovadores en el **Venetian** por no mencionar la Plaza de San Marcos donde parece que estás a la intemperie.

La colección de arte del Bellaggio, con piezas muy caras, hay una exposición de Monet esta semana, por \$15 la entrada.

Todo sobre la Música en el **hotel y casino Hard Rock.**



La nuez más grande del mundo de oro donde estará? En el **Golden Nugget.**

El Strip (calle principal) de noche, pruebe la vista desde el bar en lo alto del Rio.

Paris, la torre Eifel puede que sea la mitad en tamaño que la original, pero la replica es exquisita y las luces se pusieron en su 100º aniversario y se construyó según los planos originales de Gustave Eifels.



El High Roller es la atracción de observación más grande del mundo con 28 ranuras transparentes con capacidad para 40 pasajeros de hasta 550 pies/170 metros de altura.

El monorraíl funciona desde las 7 am hasta las 2 am (hasta las 3 am los fines de semana). Un autobús lanzadera va gratis de los hoteles Sams Town y Rio a la estación de monorraíl. Este año los tickets de entrada de Conexpo incluyen un pase de monorraíl para la semana, por lo que es un incentivo aún mayor para usarlo, aunque podría ser más engorroso, el tiempo lo dirá.

Be warned that during Conexpo the better places will be tough to get into and even if you do reserve be prepared for your table not to be available until well after the time you reserved. Sounds like the crane business!

Aureole

If you are a wine buff this might be just the place for you. The restaurant is built around a four storey glass wine storage tower. The wine list is a computer tablet, allowing to search by country, grape variety or whatever. With some 800 cabernets for example, it is a bit of gimmick and expensive. The food is good but not great, the prix fixe menu is \$125 with supplements but if you are out to impress?

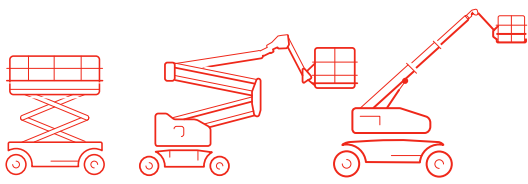

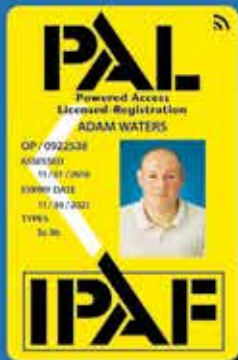


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
