New MEWP product group

PAF is to set up and run a new MEWP product group upon request from FEM (Fédération Européenne de la Manutention), the influential grouping of trade associations of which IPAF recently became a member. Reporting to the FEM General Assembly in Sweden, IPAF's Giles Councell said that, "at a meeting of manufacturers following the IPAF Board meeting in Maastricht, all thirteen expressed a keen interest in joining FEM and taking part in the product group".

IPAF is encouraging all European manufacturers or companies which supply the European market to join FEM through their own national association - in Britain, the **British Materials Handling** Federation.

IPAF assists simulator development

PAF says it is developing a platform simulator with Aims Solutions, a spin-off from the University of Nottingham's School of Chemical, Environmental and Mining Engineering, in a bid to streamline operator training. IPAF is the first to admit that simulator training will never replace essential hands-on experience, but it does provide a useful tool to speed up the assessment of

new operators. Putting those with limited experience directly into real platforms demands higher levels of supervision from instructors and is a potential training bottleneck.

The development model is based on a JLG 600AJ platform (see pic) and will be complete in the next few weeks. Full information on simulator packages will be available later this year.
