News is bound to spring up from the SED show ground, but undoubtedly the biggest crane industry story for months broke at Conexpo in March. Manitowoc is buying Grove Worldwide for just \pounds 190 million in cash and shares. The deal, which should be finalised within the next month or so, means that Manitowoc will have an \pounds 850 million annual turnover and become the world's largest crane manufacturer.

It's no surprise that conjecture is rife. Will any Grove staff be made redundant? Can a company which sells crawler and tower cranes successfully add mobile cranes to its sales structure? And what will happen to Grove Manlift – many thought that the access side of Grove was likely to close down before this news – will it now become an enhancement of the Liftlux Potain range owned by Manitowoc? It will be intriguing to watch how this combination of French, American, British and German companies rub along together.

Back in the UK, the recent IPAF Health and Safety forum at Old Trafford was exceptionally well attended and discussed some vital safety issues surrounding the use of telehandlers as work platforms. The day is reviewed on page 43, whilst telehandlers go under the microscope on page23.
